

Championing Road Safety



After the tragic loss of life on Brediland Road last November, the local Scottish Liberal Democrats are fighting to champion safer roads in Renfrewshire.

With the Scottish Government Vision Zero target of having no one killed or seriously injured on roads by 2045, the Lib Dems aim to hold the SNP administration on Renfrewshire Council to account.

Local councillor Anne Hannigan has spoken to crossing patrollers on Brediland Road with major worries about action not happening to tackle speeding on the road until more deaths occur.

"Local Community Council members and other residents are incredibly concerned at the lack of the correct crossings and speed cameras. They tell me of people being ignored when trying to cross the roads. Crossing patrollers said that not only are they ignored even in their highly visible uniforms, but often have horns blown at them, with some drivers shouting and gesticulating angrily when they are just trying to keep the children safe."

Anne and the local Scottish Lib Dems will keep fighting to make sure action is taken to improve the safety of Brediland Road and other roads around Renfrewshire.
